COMMUNITY EMPOWERMENT IN WASTE MANAGEMENT TOWARDS A CLEAN ENVIRONMENTAL CULTURE IN TRIHARJO VILLAGE, SLEMAN

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ABSTRACT

The objectives of this activity are: (1) initial socialization of the importance of a clean living culture; (2) presentation of material on the importance of waste management and the use of SIPARI towards a clean culture; and (3) assistance in waste management. Based on the problems that have been described, it is necessary to conduct training and assistance in the 3R mechanism and the use of the SIPARI application in order to achieve its objectives properly. The culture of using the application still needs to be introduced and improved. This is in line with the application that was built to facilitate and speed up data collection in waste management. With the SIPARI application, online and real time waste management can be carried out. In addition, the general public can also view the waste management data. Household waste is waste that comes from daily activities in the household. The reality of waste management in the community: 1. Burning household waste. 2. Throw in the river. 3. Dispose of in vacant land/illegal TPS (illegal dumping) 4. Dispose of waste at official TPS and then transport it to TPA. Only a small part of the community sorts and processes waste. Whereas the DIY Regional Regulation No. 3 of 2013 mandates that everyone is obliged to reduce or limit waste generation (Article 10) and everyone who produces waste is obliged to manage their waste, at least sorting waste from its source (Article 19). Waste management must be done as well as possible so as not to cause various problems.
