

# EXPLORATION STUDY OF WAITING TIME GRADUATES OF S-2 SPORTS SCIENCE PROGRAM IN OBTAINING A JOB

## ABSTRACT

Tracer Study research aims to find out employment absorption and as an evaluation for study programs, and can provide important information about the relationship (link) between the world of higher education and the world of work. S-2 Sports Science Study Program FIK UNY, Knowing the waiting period for alumni to get a job, Relevance between Graduates of S-2 Sports Science Study Program FIK UNY and the relevance of graduate work.

Research respondents amounted to 152 respondents with a class entering college from 2007 to 2019. Based on data obtained by the Master of Sports Science, FIK UNY has 1 foreign student (0.66%) from the University of Burundi Institute of Physical Education and Sports, and 151 domestic students (99.33%) with the majority of 59.21% (90 students) coming from UNY who continued to the Masters Program in Sports Science, FIK UNY, 40.79 (62 students) from outside UNY. The majority of students who continue their studies have worked in various fields while continuing their master's studies, namely 110 students (72.36%), 27.63% (42 people) have not worked. Jobs after graduation are 36.18% (55 people) as teachers, 33.55% (51 people) as lecturers, 15.13% (23 people who are not suitable for graduates, 5.92% (9 people) are entrepreneurs, 4, 61% (7 people) as Professional trainers, 2.63% (4 people) as Sports Consultants, 1.32% (2 people) as Sports Therapists, 0.66% (1 Person) as Professional Trainers. with graduates in the high category 98 respondents (64.47%), moderate 42 respondents (27.67%), and low 12 respondents (7.89%). Based on the data obtained, interest in further study for S-3 as follows: further and have passed 2 respondents (1.32%), continue to take doctoral degree 28 respondents (18.42%), are about to continue doctoral degree 31 respondents (21.05%), not continue doctoral degree 90 respondents (59.21%).
