The Tracer Study research aims to determine job absorption and as an evaluation for study programs, and can provide important information regarding the relationship (link) between the world of higher education and the world of work. Tracer Study research aims and benefits of this research are to find out: The profile of graduates in the Sports Science Doctoral Study Program FIK UNY, find out the active work status of graduates, the relevance of graduates of the Sports Science Doctoral Study Program FIK UNY and the relevance of graduate work, as well as contribution achievements university to graduates.

The research respondents numbered 23 respondents with a college intake class from 2020 to the 2020 intake. Based on data obtained by the Sports Science Doctoral Program, FIK UNY had 1 foreign student from the University of Burundi Institute of Physical Education and Sports. The majority of students who are continuing their studies are actively working, 21 people, and those who are not actively working are 27.63% (2 people).

Employment after graduation is 36.18% (55 people) as a teacher, 33.55% (51 people) as a lecturer, 15.13% (23 people are not graduates, 5.92% (9 people) are self-employed, 4, 61 % (7 people) as Professional trainers, 2.63 % (4 people) as Sports Consultants, 1.32 % (2 people) as Sports Therapists, 0.66 % (1 Person) as Professional Trainers. Job suitability with graduates in the high category 98 respondents (64.47%), medium 42 respondents (27.67%), and low 12 respondents (7.89%). Based on the data obtained, interest in further study for a doctoral degree is as follows: continued and 2 respondents (1.32%) have graduated, 28 respondents (18.42%) are continuing their doctoral degree, 31 respondents are going to continue their doctoral degree (21.05%), 90 respondents (59.21%) are not continuing their doctoral degree. The conclusion of this study is to continue to maintain contributions in the development of the Sports Science Doctoral Study Program at FIKK UNY. And there is also a need for collaboration with foreign universities to attract foreign students to study at the Sports Science Doctoral Program at FIKK UNY.
