## **ABSTRACT**

Japan is one of the countries that has a large number of diaspora and most of them are people who will return to Indonesia. These Indonesian citizens who return to Indonesia (repatriation) need assistance, especially in choosing schools for their children and adapting to socioeconomic conditions in Indonesia. Therefore they need knowledge and assistance during the repatriation process. This service aims to provide assistance and socialization about health in order to maintain health from Covid-19, the development of educational conditions and socio-economic activities of the community in Indonesia in preparation for the repatriation of diaspora from Japan to Indonesia.
