TRACKING GRADUATES FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION STUDY PROGRAM FOR HEALTH AND RECREATION (PJKR) FIK UNY

ABSTRACT

This research is a tracer study that aims to determine the competency profile of the alumni of the PJKR Study Program after participating in the learning process at the PJKR FIK UNY Study Program using the PJKR Study Program curriculum, identify the obstacles faced by alumni during the learning process of the PJKR FIK UNY Study Program, and find out the relevance of the curriculum applied by the UNY Study Program. PJKR with the needs of the labor market, providing input on the development of study programs, especially improving the quality of learning, obtaining an overview of the competencies needed by alumni users, providing input on improving the quality of learning in accordance with the demands of the world of work. The population in this study were alumni of the PJKR FIK UNY Study Program. Participants in this study obtained as many as 101 people. The data was obtained by distributing a questionnaire through a google form. The data for this study were collected using an open questionnaire. The sampling technique used was purposive sampling. The data that has been collected was analyzed using descriptive techniques with tabulations and percentages. The results showed that students while still in college seen from the average obtained from the indicators of length of study, writing of the final project, lecture materials, curriculum, lecturers for courses, academic culture showed the moderate category as many as 49 people (48.52%), the category high as many as 28 people (27.72%), and the low category as many as 24 people (23.76%). Judging from the aspect after graduating from college, 9 indicators were revealed, namely waiting period, type of work, benefit of knowledge and college experience in the field of work, information on getting a job, income, foreign language skills, IT skills, communication skills, and the development of alumni networks, obtained in the medium category as many as 71 people (70.30%), low and high categories as many as 15 people (14.85%). For employment status In general, it can be categorized that most of the alumni are already working, namely 94% of the alumni are working, while the alumni who have not worked are only 6%.
