PERCEPTIONS OF ALUMNI AND SPORTS TRAINING EDUCATION PROGRAM STAKEHOLDERS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE PROGRAM CURRICULUM WITH THE NEEDS OF THE WORLD OF WORK

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ABSTRACT

Graduate tracer studies are a source of information that can help universities monitor or monitor their graduates, including the waiting period for graduates' work, graduates' workplaces, suitability of graduates' work fields, and user satisfaction with graduates' competence or performance with the needs of the world of work.

The research design used in this research is quantitative descriptive research using a survey method or approach. The respondents of this research are stakeholders and alumni/graduates from the Coaching Education Study Program. The data analysis technique uses quantitative descriptive analysis with percentage analysis. Data obtained from the questionnaire is processed into percentage data for each item.

The results of the tracer study research that has been carried out are based on assessments carried out on alumni and stakeholders regarding the suitability of the PKO FIKK UNY curriculum to world needs based on ethical aspects, namely 72% Very Good, 26% Good and 2% Fair. Expertise in the field of science is 73% Very Good, 26% Good and 1% Fair. Foreign language skills are 9% Very Good, 59% Good, 30% Fair and 2% Poor. The use of information technology is 58% Very Good, 41% Good and 1% Fair. Communication skills are 68% Very Good and 32% Good. Teamwork is 78% Very Good, 20% Good, 1% Fair and 1% Poor. Self-development is 69% Very Good, 28% Good, 2% Fair and 1% Poor. Based on the research results above, it can be concluded that the PKO FIKK UNY Undergraduate Study Program curriculum is in line with the needs of the world of work. The output of this research is in the form of articles that will be published in reputable national journals.
