DISASTER MITIGATION MANAGEMENT TRAINING IN DISASTER-PRONE AREAS AS A SPORT TOURISM INDUSTRY

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ABSTRACT

Improving the quality and quality of the sport tourism industry to be more comprehensive as well as competitive can be done in accordance with the National Tourism Development Master Plan 2010 - 2025, among others: (1) Increasing Recreational Sports Human Resources by coaching, developing and improving skills through training. Activities that support the success of government programs in building the community's economy through sports tourism programs are carried out through community service activities by involving local residents in disaster-prone areas with the potential of the sports tourism industry expected to be able to generate the economy. The purpose of this service activity is to assist and encourage the improvement of community competencies in disaster-prone areas through the development of sports tourism: 1) improve skills, abilities, and understanding, especially for people in disaster mitigation areas in the field of sports tourism. 2) increase cooperation between UNY Lecturers. Disaster Mitigation Practitioners, Sport Tourism Practitioners and the people of the Merapi mountain area. The target of this activity is the manager of Tankaman on the slopes of Mount Merapi, Yogyakarta Special Region whose area is in the radius of the mountain disaster-prone zone. The service activities were carried out using lecture, observation, and demonstration methods. The workshop implemented in Tan Kaman Tourism Village was carried out effectively during the development of sports tourism as one of the nation's economic milestones. This activity cannot be directly seen and felt by the community and tourists who come to the Tan Kaman area, therefore regular monitoring and evaluation is needed from various related parties, both from the government, educational institutions, and pokdarwis from the region so that later the potential of Tan Kaman can be maximized for the welfare of the local community.
